



Students, you have already come to know about the causes of contaminated food. Can you tell me those causes?


There is one more cause of the contamination of food – Houseflies.







D. Lest the water should finish






hand pump's water. In fact, to raise our life standards we have lowered the level of water.




Be Honest



Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, was a scientist. He was born in 1931 in the state of Tamil Nadu. He was born in a poor family. From his childhood, he studied and simultaneously worked with his family. 

"From the trees." all the children say in a very loud voice.





"Because I did not need a rank," the bird laughed and said.


"Why?" the lion asked in amazement.



My Parents advised me to be obedient to the teachers, do school work, whole heartedly. After completing school work, getting the notebook checked over.



Children! I do remember my school, send regards to my foundation teachers. With love I have sent you some books. My friends! three things are of paramount importance in my success.




