## Important Note:

1. It is mandatory to get minimum $33 \%$ marks in theory and practical separately. No minimum marks are required in internal assessment (INA) but it is mandatory to get $33 \%$ marks in theory, practical (wherever applicable) and internal assessment in aggregate.
2. A candidate who has passed the Matriculation Examination from a Board other than the Punjab School Education Board can opt Punjab History and Culture in lieu of the compulsory General Punjabi subject. Such students furnish proof of not having studied Punjabi at the Matriculation level.
3. A candidate who has passed Matriculation Examination from Punjab School Education Board with 'Punjab History and Culture' as a subject can opt for 'Punjab History and Culture' in lieu of compulsory Punjabi in the 12th class.

4. The syllabus for Computer Application will be the same as prescribed for the Science Group.
5. The syllabus for Agriculture will be the same as prescribed for the Agriculture Group.
6. If a candidate chooses Economics as an elective subject, he/she can choose Business Studies or Accountancy as an additional subject and vice-versa.
